I enjoyed going on the new trampoline and playing football with my friends In August 2021, the Tulse Hill Adventure Playground ran its annual Summer Holiday Scheme, providing a space for Young People aged 8-16 to play, explore and connect with others in their community. This year 113 young people attended the playground over the course of the four-week holiday. 5% of attendees found the Adventure Playground through their school play sessions earlier in the year.

At the Adventure Playground, the emphasis is on free play, allowing young people to have creative freedom, make their own decisions, build on problem-solving skills and improve their physical wellbeing. Over the summer young people had access to trampolines, roller skates, woodworking tools, a basketball court and explored our new High Trees Bus and slide.

As well as exploring the Adventure Playground we ensure that during the Summer Play Scheme young people have the chance to go on trips out to local attractions. It's important to us that Young People have new experiences and learn about themselves and their peers in different environments. This year 45 young people attended trips out to Joss Bay, Flip Out Trampoline Park, Water Wipe Out and Brockwell Park's BMX track.

The Lambeth Council Summer of Food and Fun holiday programme invested over £1 million to provide fun activities and healthy food to young people in Lambeth over the Summer. High Trees were grateful to receive

funding for lunches and a local Tulse Hill company, Eternal Nursery Farm provided us with natural Caribbean food. Lambeth Council also provided 50 'Take and Make' boxes for families to encourage healthy cooking at home.

At the end of the Summer, Building Young Brixton, a consortium of nine Lambeth Youth organisations hosted a Summer Party at the Adventure Playground. The party brought together young people and staff from Grove Adventure Playground and IRMO. Partnership events encourage young people from different Lambeth

organisations to experience new spaces and make connections across the borough. The Summer Party was a Hawaiian theme and young people enjoyed inflatable games, water fights and a photo booth.
