We are especially looking for innovative tutors who are passionate about supporting learners with low confidence to achieve their personal learning goals.

Ideally, we are looking for applicants with experience of teaching in the Adult Education sector, whether in a community setting or an adult education provider. However, we also welcome applications from teachers who have recently completed their teacher training and are looking for their first role or those ready for a new adventure. We will provide additional support to newly qualified tutors.

Candidates must be enthusiastic and passionate about nurturing and helping learners to succeed whilst maintaining the highest levels of quality in teaching and learning.

Tutors must be excited to sit at the heart of our Education and Training team and to support our learners to succeed and progress into their next steps.

A commitment to continual professional development is essential.

ROLE OVERVIEW

- To plan and deliver a programme of learning to support learners' digital skills. Courses may be accredited or non-accredited and levels usually range from Entry 1 to Level 1.
- To advise learners of the requirements needed to complete the course and to plan for any additional learning needs.
- To maintain course files and complete course documentation. This requires completion of a course register, group profile, a scheme of work, lesson plans and individual learning plans, This is essential for High Trees and our funders to quality assure our courses.
- To provide evidence or document observations of learner work and achievement.
- To promote participation in learner surveys.
- To provide learners with advice and guidance about possible progression routes following each course.
- To be committed to Continuous Professional Development (CPD), keeping up to date with your subject area and attending relevant training and meetings as required.
- To maintain a safe environment for learners, in accordance with the Health & Safety at Work Act and High Trees safeguarding and Prevent procedures.
- To ensure compliance with relevant legislation (e.g. General Data Protection Regulations, Copyright etc.)
- To promote equality and diversity and use teaching materials and methods that are relevant to a diverse learner group.
- To undertake any other duties as may reasonably be requested.

Our freelance tutors work independently but are responsible to the Quality and Progression Lead and Head of Education. They will also need to be in regular liaison with the Data and Performance Lead, Learner Support Officer and Education and Training Administrator.

Essential

- An appropriate Level 3, 4 or 5 teaching qualification (CTLLS/L4 Certificate in Education and Training, DTLLS/L5 Diploma in Education and Training, PGCE).
- Experience of presenting and delivering subject specific workshops or training sessions.
- An understanding of, and commitment to, promoting equality, diversity and inclusion, anti-discriminatory practice and safeguarding policy and procedures as appropriate to the post.
- An ability to develop and maintain course materials of a good standard that meet the needs of a variety of different learners.
- Knowledge and experience of appropriate teaching and learning methods that enable learners from a range of backgrounds and communities to progress.
- Good organisational and record keeping skills.
- A commitment to continuing professional development with an interest and ability in developing new and creative approaches to teaching.
- Excellent interpersonal skills with the ability to work independently as well as contribute to the work of a team.
- Good use of Microsoft Office/ICT in the learning environment which will allow the production of learning materials, maintenance of records and administration related to teaching.
- A commitment to create and maintain a safe, supportive and welcoming environment where everyone is treated with dignity and their culture and identity are respected and valued.
